SUBJECT: Mental Health Awareness

A NEW report by the Chartered Institute of Building (CIOB) has found that one in four construction workers have considered suicide.

A report - 'Understanding Mental Health in the Built Environment' - has been published to mark Mental Health Awareness Week (18-24 May 2020) and found that:

- **26%** of construction industry professionals thought about taking their own lives in 2019;
- **56%** of construction professionals work for organisations with no policies on mental health in the workplace;
- **97%** of those surveyed recorded being stressed at least once in the last year.

Other significant related findings include:



- men frequently feel unable to discuss their mental wellbeing due to 'hyper-masculine' expectations of how they should behave;
- female construction workers often have to work with poor or no toilet facilities and inadequate sanitary conditions;
- over **30%** of all construction sites have no hot water or toiletry facilities.

The President of the CIOB said: "It is almost guaranteed that COVID-19 will have made things worse in the industry" adding that, "Tackling mental ill-health is going to remain a significant challenge for the industry over the next few years, and we must work as a collective - involving industry, government, and professional bodies - to make more fundamental changes and improvements to mental health provision."
