

No consent case at MARAC

Has the IDVA been able to gain consent?

Yes – information shared by the IDVA as per usual process.

No – through the MARAC meeting, is there any other agency actively involved with the victim?

Yes – look to set an action for that agency to attempt to feedback and gain consent for support service intervention.

No – consider alternative options to try and obtain consent and engage with the victim.

Are there any substance misuse services involved with any parties that can attempt to discuss domestic abuse concerns with the victim if given the opportunity?

Is there any rationale to make a GP appt for any party so the GP could try and discuss domestic abuse concerns with the victim?

Are there any hospital appts/maternity appts where the safeguarding team could attend and attempt to discuss domestic abuse concerns?

Any opportunities to speak to the employer (where appropriate) to try and engage further with domestic abuse services?

Is any party on a waiting list with LPFT for treatment, where a face-to-face appt could be offered to try and discuss domestic abuse concerns with the victim?

Is the property a council property or is there a registered social landlord – if so, is there an option for a housing officer to see any party and attempt to engage with the victim? Consider if any party is going through the homelessness route and an officer could attempt engagement?

• Any party = victim, perpetrator or child
